

Professor Jean-Christophe Galloux,

born in 1959, is graduated from the university of Burgundy (LLM in private law, 1983), of the European University Institute of Florence (LLM in European and comparative law, 1987) and the university of Bordeaux (Doctorat d'Etat en droit : Ph.D. Summa cum laude, 1988). He became professor at the university of Reims in 1991 (National professor examination : agrégation, 1991). He has been elected as professor of law at the university of Paris, Panthéon-Assas (Paris II , Faculty of law of the former “Sorbonne”) in 2000, where he holds the Chair in industrial property.

He teaches intellectual property law and competition law at the Law faculty of Paris and at the International center for Intellectual Property Law of Strasbourg (CEIPI).

He has been visiting professor in these matters at the universities of Montréal (Canada), Casablanca (Marroco), Bahrein, Budapest (ELTE), München (LMU and Max-Planck Institute), Tokyo (Toddaï).

He is the author of more than 180 publications in intellectual property law, competition law, and pharmaceutical and biotechnology law. He belongs to the Board of Revue Trimestrielle de Droit Commercial since 2000 (Dalloz editor), and is the co-founder of the new legal review Propriétés Intellectuelles (Thomson editor). He recently published several books : "Droit de la propriété industrielle" (Collection « Cours », Dalloz, Paris 2003, 2nd edition, 600 p.) and "Les biotechnologies en débat : pour une démocratie scientifique" (Balland, Paris 2002, 260 p.). Is also co-author with Pr. Jacques Azema of “Droit de la propriété industrielle” (Collection “Précis”, Dalloz, 750 pages, to be released summer '06), which is the leading academic book in this field. He also prepares with Pr. Parleani a Treaty on “European Intellectual property Law” to be published by De Kluwer for spring 2007 in Den Haag (The Netherlands).

He has been an adviser to the European Commission, UNESCO and OECD for IP matters and a member of the European Ethic Committee for the European Federation of Biotech Industries (EUROPABIO) in Brussels (1999-2003).

He is also member of Paris bar since 1984, where he practices intellectual property matters.
