

## **Professor Andrew F. Christie**

Andrew Christie is the Davies Collison Cave Professor of Intellectual Property at the University of Melbourne Law School. He is also the founding Director of the Intellectual Property Research Institute of Australia (IPRIA), a national centre for interdisciplinary research on the economics, law and management of intellectual property, based at the University of Melbourne. Andrew has Bachelors degrees in Science and in Law from the University of Melbourne, an LLM from the University of London, and a PhD from the University of Cambridge. He is admitted to legal practice in Australia and the United Kingdom, and worked for many years in the intellectual property departments of law firms in Melbourne and London. Andrew is an active adviser to governments and inter-governmental organizations on intellectual property law and policy, and is a current member of the Australian government's Advisory Council on Intellectual Property. In July 2005 he was identified by the international magazine *Managing IP* as one of the world's 50 most influential people in intellectual property.
